2026 CHAMPIONSHIPS GENERAL REGULATIONS

1. All Sixty & Worcestershire Motor Club Ltd (hereby known as the 'Club') championships are open to fully elected and/or paid-up members of the Club and such members are automatically registered for all Club championships.
2. The Club website will be the official bulletin of the championships. Any changes of event will be notified through this <http://www.sixtyworcsmc.co.uk> as well as the Club newsletter.
3. The decision of the committee will be final with regards to the running of the Club championships and no provision is made for protests. All competitors entering any Club championship agree to be bound by all the rules. Further awards with each championship may be presented at the discretion of the committee.
4. Points calculations will be taken from the event organisers final results and may only be scored after a Club membership card has been issued. If there are less than three starters in a class, the points awarded will be half of the number calculated (rounded down).
5. It will be the competitor's responsibility to supply final results and an entry list to the Championship Secretary within one month of an event or to give notification in writing of having marshalled on an event, with the exception of Sixty & Worcestershire Motor Club organised events, where all results must be provided by the organising team, within one month of an event.
6. On all events qualifying for the championship where results and entry lists are submitted, competitors must nominate, where possible, Sixty & Worcestershire Motor Club as their named club.
7. Result sheets must be emailed to the Championship Results Co-Ordinator trophypoints@sixtyworcsmc.co.uk or posted to Sixty & Worcestershire Motor Club Ltd, "Arron", Ross Road, Newent, Gloucestershire GL18 1BE

OFF-ROAD CHAMPIONSHIP

1. The Championship will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire Motor Club 'Off-road Championship'.
2. There will be a maximum of nine events with the best six scores to count. In the event of only eight events, five will score. If there are only seven events, then the best five will score. If there are six events, the best four will score. If there are five events, the best three will score. If there are less than five events the Championship may be declared void.
3. Each finisher will score points as follows:
- 4.

$$\frac{25 \text{ start points}}{\text{No. in class} + 1} \text{ minus position in class} \times 100$$

No. in class

The number in the class is the number of starters in the class. The position in the class includes all finishers that are classified. Competitors are also referred to General Regulation 4 on Page 2."

5. Awards will be presented as follows: -
 - 1st Overall Trophy to be held for 11 months plus an award.
 - 2nd. O/A An award subject to 5 eligible competitors
 - 3rd. O/A An award, subject to 10 eligible competitors
 - 4th. O/A An award, subject to 12 eligible competitors
 - 5th. O/A An award, subject to 15 eligible competitors
 - Young Driver Award (under 25 Years at 31st December 2026)
 - A Newcomer award to the highest new member since Sept 2025
6. Any ties will be decided in the favour of the competitor with the greatest number of higher scores and in the event of a tie still existing, in favour of the highest score on the first scoring Championship round.
7. The selected events for the year are any Club events and certain events from other clubs as notified by the Competition Secretary in the Club newsletter and/or the Club web site.
8. Named officials on the organising team of Off-Road events can claim points equal to their average score during the year. These points can only be claimed once and will be one of their qualifying scores. The points awarded will be derived from an average of points from the whole year; average = Total rounds scores / number of rounds competed e.g., 408/6=68. If the number of rounds completed is less than three, three will be used as the number of rounds completed.
9. To be eligible for an award in the Off-Road championship a competitor must have marshalled on a Sixty and Worcestershire Motor Club event during the year. Marshaling on an AutoSOLO that you are competing in does not count.

THE MARSHALS CHAMPIONSHIP

THE KEN BURSTON MEMORIAL TROPHY

Ken Burston was the founder secretary of the Sixty Motor Club in 1960 and the driving force behind the club during its early years. He competed in a few events, but his main interest was organising and marshalling. He organised the Club's first restricted rally in 1964, a 200-mile event with 80 controls. He designed the first club badge and was a stage commander on the RAC rally several times in Radnor and Myherin. He wrote many articles for the club magazine and instigated the club becoming a limited company. He was made a life member of the club in 2010 and died in 2021 at the age of 96.

1. The championship will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire Motor 'Club Marshals Championship'. This championship is for marshalling.
2. The championship will be open to any event that is run under the rules of the Motorsport UK.
3. Points will be awarded as follows: -
 - 30 points** for organising a Sixty & Worcestershire, MSUK permitted event as a named official in the regulations.
 - 20 points** for marshalling on any Sixty & Worcestershire Club run event.
 - 20 points** for marshalling for a Sixty & Worcestershire Club member.
 - 10 points** for marshalling on any other clubs' event in any capacity.Additional points will be awarded at the rate of **5 points** per day.
4. It will be the Club member's responsibility to inform the Championship Results Co-Ordinator – trophypoints@sixtyworccsmc.co.uk
5. On Club organised events points will be awarded as per the marshals signing on sheet or results sheets provided by the main organising team

THE STAGE RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

1. The Championship will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire Stage Rally Championship.
2. The Championship will be decided by the best 6 scores. After submitting 6 scores, a competitor may submit further scores and drop any lower scores previously submitted.
3. Awards will be presented to both the Driver & Co-driver as follows:-
 - 1st. Overall
 - 2nd. O/A An award subject to 5 eligible competitors
 - 3rd. O/A An award, subject to 10 eligible competitors
 - 4th. O/A An award, subject to 12 eligible competitors
 - 5th. O/A An award, subject to 15 eligible competitors.A Newcomer award to the highest new member since September 2023.
4. Ties will be decided in favour of the competitor with the highest score from the first event entered.
5. Points will be awarded as follows:

25 points for starting.

$$\frac{(\text{No. in class} + 1) \text{ minus position in class}}{\text{No in class}} \times 100$$

Number in class is the number of starters in class. Position in class includes all finishers that are classified.

6. The championship cannot be won on start points alone.
7. The selected events for the year are any Stage event run under rules of the Motorsport UK, excluding events running on an historic permit or when the competitor is entered in a historic class.

THE ROAD RALLY CHAMPIONSHIP

1. The Championship will be known as the Sixty & Worcestershire 'Road Rally Championship'.
2. The championship will be decided by the best 6 scores. After submitting 6 scores, a competitor may submit further scores and drop any lower scores previously submitted.
3. Awards will be presented to both the Drive & Navigator as follows: -
 - 1st Overall
 - 2nd. O/A an award subject to 5 eligible competitors
 - 3rd. O/A an award subject to 10 eligible competitors
 - 4th. O/A an award subject to 12 eligible competitors
 - 5th. O/A an award subject to 15 eligible competitors.
4. Any ties will be decided in favour of the competitor with the greatest number of higher scores, and in the event of a tie still existing in favour of the highest score on the first scoring championship event.
5. Points will be awarded as follows:

25 points for starting.

$$\frac{(\text{No. in class} + 1) \text{ minus position in class}}{\text{No in class}} \times 100$$

Number in class is the number of starters in class. Position in class includes all finishers that are classified.

6. The championship cannot be won on start points alone.
7. The selected events for the year are: - any Road Rally, Targa Rally, 12 Car Rally, Scatter and Navex and/or appropriate road event with navigation, run under the rules of the Motorsport UK. Excluding events run on an historic permit.

HISTORIC/CLASSIC RALLY

CHAMPIONSHIPS

1. The Championship will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire 'Historic/Classic Rally Championship'.
2. The Championship will be decided by the best 6 scores. After submitting 6 scores, a competitor may submit further scores and drop any lower scores previously submitted.
3. Awards will be presented to both the Drive & Navigator as follows:
 - 1st. Overall,
 - 2nd. O/A An award subject to 5 eligible competitors
 - 3rd. O/A An award, subject to 10 eligible competitors
 - 4th. O/A An award, subject to 12 eligible competitors
 - 5th. O/A An award, subject to 15 eligible competitors.Further awards may be presented at the discretion of the committee.
4. Ties will be decided in favour of the competitor with the highest score from the first event entered.
5. Points will be awarded as follows:

25 points for starting.

$$\frac{(\text{No. in class} + 1) \text{ minus position in class} \times 100}{\text{No in class}}$$

Number in class is the number of starters in class. Position in class includes all finishers that are classified.

6. The championship cannot be won on start points alone.
7. The selected events for the year are any bona-fide Historic event (or class within an event), either Road or Stage, run under the rules of the Motorsport UK.

THE SPRINT AND HILL CLIMB CHAMPIONSHIP

1. The Championship will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire 'Sprint and Hill Climb Championship'.
2. The Championship will be decided by the best 6 scores. After submitting 6 scores, a competitor may submit further scores and drop any lower scores previously submitted.
3. Awards will be presented as follows:-
 - 1st. Overall
 - 2nd. O/A An award subject to 5 eligible competitors
 - 3rd. O/A An award, subject to 10 eligible competitors
 - 4th. O/A An award, subject to 12 eligible competitors
 - 5th. O/A An award, subject to 15 eligible competitors.Further awards may be presented at the discretion of the committee.
4. Ties will be decided in favour of the competitor with the highest score from the first event entered.
5. Points will be awarded as follows:

$$\frac{25 \text{ start points}}{\text{No. in class} + 1} \text{ minus position in class} \times 100$$

No in class

The number in the class is the number of starters in the class. The position in the class includes all finishers that are classified.

6. The championship cannot be won on start points alone.
7. The selected events for the year are any Sprint or Hill Climb event run under rules of the Motorsport UK.

THE ALICE STEEL CHAMPIONSHIP

Alice Steel was the wife of Dr W D Steel, the Club President from 1975 to 1988. Although well past his days of competing Doc Steel would often be seen attending Club events, even in some pretty adverse weather! Alice, always known as Mrs Steel, would often be by his side, perhaps not in the adverse weather. She always accompanied him to the Club's Annual Dinner and Dance and Awards Evenings. Although she enjoyed a joke with an inuendo, woe betide the guest speaker that used inappropriate language!! Sadly she passed away in 1984, and in her memory Doc Steel gave the Club The Alice Steel Trophy, to be presented to the "Best Lady Driver".

1. The Championship will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire Motor Club The Alice Steel Championship'.
2. The championship is open to any female competitor competing in any of the Clubs Championships.
3. Awards will be presented to the best Driver and best Co-Driver/Navigator as follows:
 - 1st. Driver – The Alice Steel Cup
 - 1st. Navigator – The Committee Cup
 - 2nd. O/A An award, subject to 5 eligible competitors
 - 3rd. O/A An award, subject to 10 eligible competitors
 - Further awards may be presented at the discretion of the committee
4. Scoring will be from all Club championships. The five best scores to count.

THE IAN “NODDY” WATKINS MEMORIAL TROPHY

Ian “Noddy” Watkins was an active member of the Club in the 1960/70/80s competing in a variety of cars such as a Hillman Imp, NSU Prinz, Mini Moke, Capri, Sunbeam and a SAAB 96. He was the last person to win the combined Club Championship in 1965 before the Off-Road and Stage Championships were separated. He ran a motor accessory shop for a time and then his own Tyre Depot. He was a very popular club member and died whilst competing on the Greenleaves Rally in 1986.

1. The trophy will be awarded annually to the ‘Best All-Round Driver’.
2. The trophy is open to all competitors in any of the Club’s championships:
3. Only drivers will score points for this trophy.
4. Each competitor will have their best four events from each championship nominated by the Competition/Championship Secretary. These scores must include a minimum of two Club Championships.
5. Scoring will be from all Club championships, the score from that championship will be taken.
6. Each Driver must compete in at least two disciplines to take the award.

THE CORKSCREW CUP

1. This award will be known as the Sixty and Worcestershire Motor Club ‘Corkscrew Cup’.
2. The Competition is open to all Club members.
3. The Corkscrew Cup will be awarded to the best placed competitor in Club run AutoSOLO during the year.
4. Points will be scored as follows.

On each AutoSOLO event throughout the year an average time will be calculated based on every competitors’ overall times then each eligible competitor will score a point for every second they are faster than the average time.

5. In the event of a tie, the competitor with the highest points on the first event, will be the winner. If still tied, the competitor with the highest points on the second event will be the winner.

THE PETE DODSCHUN CUP

FOR SERVICES TO THE SIXTY & WORCESTERSHIRE MOTOR CLUB

Pete Dodschun competed in numerous rallies both as a driver and a navigator from the 1970s. He drove on the Conover Stages, the Woodpecker Stages, and the Long Marston Stages as well as the Ross Traders Classic Road Rally. He co-drove several times for Alan Corns and Andy Taylor. He was a Committee Member and magazine editor for several years. He was always marshalling on club events and did a lot of promotional work in the background, so it is fitting that the “Services to the Club” award is named after him. He died in 2014.

1. This trophy will be awarded annually and is open to all Club members.
2. The Pete Dodschun Cup will be awarded to the Club member, as nominated and voted for by the Committee, who has gone above and beyond for the Club during the year.

THE SILVER SPANNER

BEST SERVICE CREW OF THE YEAR

1. This trophy will be awarded annually and is open to all Club members.
2. The Silver Spanner will be awarded to the Club member(s), as nominated and voted for by the Committee, who has gone out and serviced on any event. Nominations to be sent to trophypoints@sixtyworcsmc.co.uk

THE SUSTAINABILITY AWARD

1. This trophy will be awarded annually and is open to all Club members.
2. In 2025, the Motor Club received its accreditation for sustainability from Motorsport UK. For 2026, a new discretionary award encourages all Club members to do their bit for protecting the environment alongside our events. The Club's Sustainability Officer will nominate an award winner based on activities witnessed and feedback received. There's no limit to the number of nominations per individual, as long as they demonstrate a clear understanding of the club's commitment to sustainability.
